From the Pastor's Desk:

Are you old enough to remember the book *Journey Inward, Journey Outward* by Elizabeth O'Connor of the Church of the Savior in Washington, DC? Her basic premise, that individuals and congregations need to tend their inner journey with God and each other, and also tend their outward journey of service to their community, continues to resonate with me. The interesting things going on at East Union in the near future remind me that healthy congregations spend time looking both inward and outward. We will have opportunities to do both of those things in the coming months as we walk together into the future God has for us.

First of all, we will hear from Tim Detweiler on Sunday morning, June 8, during the Sunday School hour about the "Roadmap" for us to follow with Firman Gingerich when he joins us soon as our transitional interim pastor. Tim and three other listeners from Central Plains conference spent a full Saturday hearing our concerns and hopes for the future of this congregation. Tim has thoughtfully summarized those comments and, based on the congregation's input, crafted some recommendations for Firman and East Union to work on together during the coming interim time.

You will find copies of the Roadmap Assessment report in your mailboxes this week. Join us during the Sunday School hour on June 8 to hear Tim present about the Roadmap and get our feedback.

Vacation Bible School gives us an opportunity to reach out into the community at the same time we help educate our children about God's love and care. If you aren't teaching, please pray for teachers, staff and students as they work and learn together June 20 and 21. We look forward to hearing about VBS during worship time on Sunday, June 22.

At the same time as Bible School, Central Plains conference has its annual meeting just one hour south of us at Iowa Wesleyan College in Mt Pleasant. Jewel Gingerich Longenecker (a Kalona native and IMS grad, whose parents and brother are buried in our cemetery) will speak on being formed by God's Word. Her messages include: 'Starving for Your Word', 'Called to Teach so that All Might Feast', and 'Formed to Teach, Formed to Lead'.

Along with delegate sessions, there are also workshops on topics ranging from the Ecuador Partnership to Social Media and the Church. Check the bulletin board outside the library for the weekend schedule and a list of workshop offerings. See Crystal in the church office for a registration form if you plan to attend.

Meanwhile, Gifts Discernment Committee may be tapping you on the shoulder soon to fill one job or another in the church. If you are asked, please prayerfully consider saying "yes!" Requests to serve mean that a number of people have discerned that you have the gifts and graces, as they say in some churches, to fill a particular role.

Prayer for all of these changes is always needed! If you think you can't participate much in the life of the church - don't underestimate how important your prayers are! We solicit your prayers for times of transition, for gifts discernment and for Firman and Susan as they are making their way westward to their new home among us next month.
