CENTRAL PLAINS and MENNONITE AGENCIES

Action alert! We need your help to support Mennonite Pastor, Max Villatoro, of Iowa City who was detained by Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) and is facing deportation. ICE arrived unannounced at Max's home at 6:30 a.m. yesterday and didn't even give him a chance to say goodbye to his wife and children. Max has four U.S. citizen children, Anthony, Etna, Angela, and Aileen, and his wife, Gloria, who love him dearly and depend on him as a pillar for their family.

Please take time to call the ICE Field Office at 888-351-4024 (choose option 2) and tell them to grant Max Villatoro a stay of removal, and explain how separating families breaks our community. Tell them that Max might be eligible for DAPA (Deferred Action for Parents of Americans), and he should be granted enough time to stay to apply once it is available. Explain to them why keeping families together is important to you, and to stop Max's deportation immediately. Max's A# is 094-338-085. You may be directed to call another number and make the case for Max to a different agent. Please call them too! The more people who hear about Max and our support of him, the better!

Mennonite Central Committee Freezing temperatures and snow are adding another layer of deprivation to Syrians and Iraqis who have been forced from their homes to escape violence from the Islamic State group and battling armies in Syria. Mennonite Central Committee is calling for financial donations as it provides heating fuel and blankets this winter and continues to address basic needs of food, shelter and education throughout the year.
